

AYS OF OLD: Visiting the 1,500-acre Wildcatter Ranch and Resort, 90 miles northwest of Fort Worth, is like taking a step back in time. Life slows down a little, and things become a bit simpler. Stroll into the town of **Graham** and walk around America's largest downtown square. Visit the ladies at **Bellaford Art Gallery**, a chapel-turned-art gallery. Or check out the locally made jewelry, belts, and boots at **Welch Western Wear**. When you've

had your fill of shopping, be sure to grab some lunch with the gals at **Gild & Nosh**, a rustic antiques store and cafe. **CALM THE WILD WEST:** Unlike when you were younger, you now appreciate the finer things in life. Which, you've come to realize, can include the simple act of sitting on the **back porch**, sipping coffee, and watching the sunrise. When you finally pull yourself out of your chair, head down to the spa for a **Swedish massage**.
